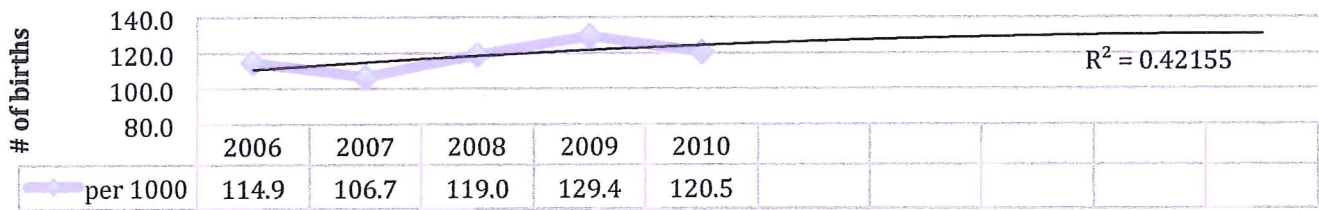
Number of simple assault arrests, 5 yr trendline



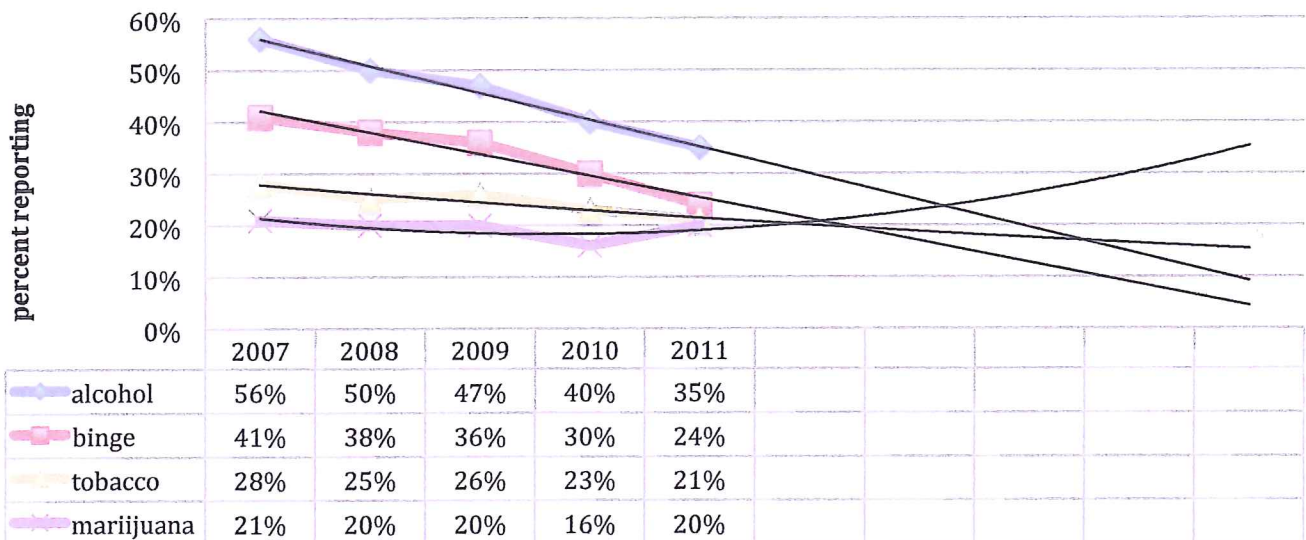
Number of Larceny Arrests 5 yr trendline
