Every July 4th holiday, thousands of Americans drive a car, motorcycle, or boat after drinking alcohol or using drugs. Impaired driving is no accident.

The rate of alcohol impairment among drivers involved in fatal crashes during the 2014 July Fourth period was over three times higher at night than it was during the day.

Did You Know?

- Drunk driving is often a symptom of a larger problem: alcohol misuse and abuse.
- Alcohol-impaired motor vehicle crashes cost more than an estimated \$37 billion annually.
- In 2012, more than 10,000 people died in alcohol-impaired driving crashes - one every 51 minutes.

While you're out celebrating our country's freedom, you could lose your own if you choose to drink and drive. Not only would you be risking your life and the lives of others—you could face a DUI arrest. The average DUI costs \$10,000, making it difficult to recover financially.

And the cost doesn't end there. Arrested drunk drivers face jail time, the loss of their driver licenses, higher insurance rates, and dozens of

Remember, with all of today’s alternatives to getting home safely, there’s no excuse for getting behind the wheel after drinking alcohol. Driving impaired is never worth the risk, not to yourself or anyone else. Plan ahead this holiday season and always. Don’t ever get behind a wheel of a vehicle when you are impaired.

TALK TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT ALCOHOL POISONING

Symptoms of alcohol poisoning:

- Person is unconscious or semi-conscious and cannot be awakened.
- Cold, clammy, pale, or bluish skin.
- Check to see if breathing is slow, less than 8 times per minute, or irregular, with 10 seconds or more between breaths.
- Vomiting while “sleeping” or passed out, and not waking up after vomiting.

If a person has any of these symptoms, he or she is suffering from acute alcohol intoxication and is in danger.

10:00 p.m. for minors under the age of 14
11:00 p.m. for minors ages 14 and 15
Midnight for minors ages 16 and 17
